A guide to dealing with impersonation.

Impersonation occurs when an individual falsely claims to represent an individual or organization in order to gain trust, influence, access to information, resources, or benefits.

The Office of the Auditor General (OAG) advises the public, government ministries, stakeholders and staff to remain vigilant against impersonation attempts.



Many impersonators aim to mislead public opinion, targeting vulnerable individuals for financial gain.



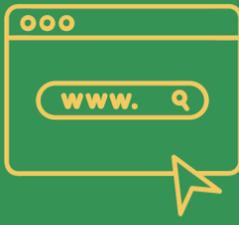
Remember, the Office of the Auditor General does not request payments, donations or confidential information through unofficial channels.

Responding to Impersonation



Do not engage with suspicious contacts.

Legitimate communication will come through established government addresses and official announcements.



Verify the contact's identity through official channels before providing any information.



Report any incidents to the relevant authorities to help prevent further impersonation attempts.
